Three Junior Auxiliary members - Sylvia Apshago, Savannah Moore, and Alaina Zeigler - attended the Department Junior Annual Meeting.





SERVICE OFFICE REPORT by Maggie Stinson/VSO

Our Service Office is now handling about 80 open Veteran claims with new clients coming in every month. Because of this heavy workload, it may mean a delay in response time to phone or email messages - please be patient while we work to help as many Veterans as possible. Once a claim is opened, we have one year to gather all the documents/information needed for each claim. Our Post Service Office does things differently from other Posts. We do a "complete claim". This means we work with each Vet to gather all necessary information that provides the VA the best possible information on the claim. The entire process for each claim can take several months to complete and get everything to the VA.

PACT ACT – Veterans seem to be confused about what the PACT ACT is all about. Simply, it is a registry of Veterans who were exposed to a toxin that is covered by the PACT ACT. It does NOT mean any extra money for the Veteran. The VA wants Veterans who were exposed to a toxin(s) to register in case the Veteran develops one of the medical presumptive conditions covered by the PACT ACT in the future. By registering, it will be noted in the Veteran's VA record.
