



He maneuvered to avoid them, but unfortunately got thrown off his bike. He succumbed to serious head injuries a few days later. Realizing that his death could have been avoided, one of Britain's very first neurosurgeons, Hugh Cairns, started researching the importance of crash helmets. His work was published in Britain's Medical Journal, titled: "Head Injuries in Motorcyclists - The Importance of the Crash Helmet". It was through his research and findings that the use of motorcycle helmets have become a requirement by law globally.



#### **American Legion Oratorical Contest**

Do you know a high school student who is interested in Government and the Constitution?

**Scholarships are available** at the Post, County, District, State, and National levels through the American Legion Oratorical Contest.

About the Oratorical Contest "A constitutional speech contest".

The American Legion Oratorical Contest exists to develop deeper knowledge and appreciation for the U.S. Constitution among high school students. Since 1938, the program has presented participants with an academic speaking challenge that teaches important leadership qualities, the history of our nation's laws, the ability to think and speak clearly, and an understanding of the duties, responsibilities, rights, and privileges of American citizenship. The program has featured numerous politicians and prominent contestants over the years, including former president candidate Alan Keyes and CNN anchor Lou Dobbs.

Young orators earn some of the most generous college scholarships available to high school students. Over \$138,000 in scholarships can be awarded each year. The overall national contest winner gets an \$25,000 scholarship. Second place takes home \$22,500, and third gets \$20,000. Each department (state) winner who is certified into and participates in the national contest's first round receives a \$2,000 scholarship. Those who advance past the first round receive an additional \$2,000 scholarship. The American Legion's National Organization awards the scholarships, which can be used at any college or university in the United States.

High school students (**all grades**) under age 20 are eligible. Competition begins at the post level and advances to a state competition. Legion department representatives certify one winner per state to the national contest, where department winners compete against each other in two speaking rounds. The contest caps off with a final round that decides the three top finishers.

The speech must be on some aspect of the U.S. Constitution, with some emphasis on the duties and obligations of citizens to our government and speeches are eight to ten minutes long; three- to five-minute speeches on an assigned topic also are part of the contest.

**FSK Post 11** will hold its contest on **January 21, 2023, at 11am.** Prizes will be 1<sup>st</sup>place \$500, 2nd place \$300, 3rd place and beyond \$100. Winner will advance to District competition in February. State Competitions will follow in March.
